Thought for the week

Prayers and Prayer Pointers -

Monday 15th September - In many island and coastal communities, there are strong traditions of drawing comparisons between the presence of the divine, and the vastness of the sea. If you've ever spent time on, or near, the ocean, it is easy to see why! - Spend some time today looking at the sea, or a picture of the

sea, or find a video of waves rolling against the shoreline (or just use your imagination!) – what do you think these visuals can teach you about God? - Pray about your reflections.

Tuesday 16th September - Lord of all faithfulness, Today I take a moment to look back at my story, To notice your hand at work in my life at various points. Carry me, this day, I pray. Amen.

Wednesday 17th September - Use one of the monotonous tasks of today as a prayer – it might be that you are washing up, or ironing, or sweeping up leaves in the garden. Let your brain be still, and listen for God's calm voice in the midst of the ongoing monotony of the task. **Thursday 18th September -** Today, let our prayers be for all those working in tackling cancer in all its forms – supporting those affected by the disease, researching cures and treatments, and providing for families and carers. - Thank you, Lord, for their patience and service.

Friday 19th September - At the end of this week, I give you thanks, O God, for the little glimpses of glory across the last few days. Amongst all that has happened, I take a few moments to notice my own gratitude and to give you the praise and the glory. - Thank you Lord, Amen.
