Sunday 30th June – Leeds –You may well have heard by now the glad news that our probationer deacon, Deacon Margaret Chipandambira, has passed her probation with flying colours and has been recommended to be ordained at the coming Conference, the service accepting her into full connexion being on Sunday the 30th of June at 10:30 and her ordination being at 4pm that afternoon at Morley Central Hall. Friends

I was scrolling through the internet the other day and came across the meme: "I'm not glass half full or glass half empty; I'm get a smaller glass and fill it to the brim." I rather liked it – it reminded me of the old song we all sang as children:

Running over, running over My cup's full and running over Since the Lord saved me, I'm as happy as can be My cup's full and running over.

It reminded me also of a sampler I have on the wall in our flat on Bute which says: "If you love everything you have, you have everything you need."

These are all simple statements which we could deconstruct and pull to pieces if we really wanted to – condemning them as sayings from a simpler time - and yet there is truth in them.

I am constantly amazed by the number of books there are written on the importance of gratitude. Gratitude we are told can help our mental health, our relationships and our understanding of the world. We are advised to keep gratitude journals in which to write down lists of "five things you are grateful for" or to write something down each day and put it in a jar and then pull out the little scraps of paper on New Year's Eve to remind ourselves of all the things that we have had to be grateful for over the previous year.

Sometimes the writers even note with some sadness, that it is hard to be grateful when we have no-one to thank. I have cause to reflect, as I often do in these types of situations, that the Church had the answer millennia ago and we know exactly to whom we give thanks.

1 Thessalonians 5:18 tells us: "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." As we approach Holy Week via Palm Sunday, we are reminded powerfully of humanity's inhumanity, and yet even so, we know that after the awfulness of Good Friday at the end of next week, we will be offered resurrection. We truly can rejoice and give thanks.

Prayers and Prayer Pointers for the Week Ahead

Monday 25th March Look at the palm of your hand. Consider the story of Palm Sunday when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey before his crucifixion and the crowds welcomed him. Think of five ways, one for each finger, that you welcome Jesus into your life?

Tuesday 26th March Pour a glass of water. Think about the things you do that get in the way of your relationship with God. You might think it muddles the water of your life, but God forgives us for all these things, and offers us living water. Drink some of the water and give thanks for the way God reaches out to you with love and forgiveness.

Wednesday 27th March You are loved. Just as you are, and completely. Today, spend time trying to accept this fundamental and important truth: God loves you.

Thursday 28th March God of all creation, I worship you. You know me - what I need, what I rejoice in, what I'm nervous about. You see me – as the unique individual you created with all my little habits and characteristics. You hear me – when I pray aloud or silently. You meet me – here and now and I am content. Amen Wonder to yourself if you are really able to say the words. Imagine what it would be like to hear someone else say them for you. Notice how you feel as you read them. Take time to tell God what you've discovered.

Friday 29th March God of the whole earth, Today I pray for refugees and exiles all around the world, Those who are living in fear and have fled the place they call home. Show me how to show love to those in need, To be a place of sanctuary to all who encounter me, In Jesus' name, Amen.

Saturday 30th March Think about the fruits of the spirit. Pick one of them that you don't feel you are very good at, or that needs some intentional work. Spend some time praying about this, and then practice it for a whole day in all you do.
